The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Trust and to enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Charities Act 1992. They are also responsible for the safeguarding of the assets of the Trust.

In accordance with the Trust Deed PDG David Taylor retired in rotation effective 30th June 2018. 1st Vice District Governor Jarvis MacDonald was appointed effective 1st July 2018.

The Trustees thank PDG David Taylor for his support and advice and for his contribution to the orderly functioning of the Trust.

Objectives

The objectives of the Trust are to hold the Trust Fund and its income upon trust to apply them for any purpose which is charitable according to the Law of England & Wales whether for the benefit of any individual, or group of people, or for the benefit of any other organisation established for charitable purposes.

- Encouraged people with intellectual disabilities to learn and take part in sporting activities in partnership with Special Olympics GB.
