# Global Service Team News - June 2022

This is my last report as I will be relinquishing this role at the end of the month. I send 2nd VDG-E Lion Sandra every good wish and hope she has a very happy and successful time on GST. I will be in the background to support her and I will also still be responsible for diabetes and competitions.

I have held the position since its inception in 2018 and it has been an interesting role. Lions in 105D (as it was in 2018) and subsequently in 105SC have always provided service to their communities.

This has been very much the case since the pandemic began in 2020. Lockdown prevented face-to-face meetings, so many Clubs met virtually and while traditional fund raising became very difficult, many Clubs still managed to help their communities.

Despite Covid-inspired rules, Lions managed to deliver medicines and shopping to those who had to self-isolate, help schools by providing laptops to pupils who were learning online, as well as funding other groups who were helping those who could not leave their homes. In fact, handson service rather than donating increased during this time. Now, the worst appears to be over and Clubs are getting back to normal and events such as Prostate Cancer Screenings can take place.

In some ways we will be needed more than ever as people face the increase in inflation with rising costs especially as regards to fuel poverty. Some Clubs already have schemes whereby they ask members of the public to give them their Winter Fuel Allowance to pass on to those less fortunate than themselves. Food Banks are getting very busy and I am sure Lions in 105SC will support them as they have in the past.

"We Serve" is our motto and I believe that Lions in 105SC certainly live up to this but unfortunately they do not always tell others about it. Reporting has improved but please Secretaries remember that this is an important part of your role to ensure that your Club's service is recorded.

## FIRST CAR SHOW FOR WOKINGHAM LIONS

## Trustees of Jersey Lions' longest running project set themselves a target of raising £3.5 million

Maison des Landes, a hotel catering exclusively for people with disabilities, is undergoing a £3.5 million refurbishment with a view to opening mid-2023 with facilities for staying visitors to Jersey and daily for Jersey residents who are elderly, disabled or otherwise disadvantaged. The hotel has been a project of the Jersey Lions since the 1960s.

To date this year the Trustees (all appointed by the President of the Lions Club of Jersey) have raised  $\pounds 3$  million towards their target.

"The pandemic caused the hotel to close in 2020," says the Trustees' president Lion Peter Tabb. "Facing prolonged closure the we saw this as an opportunity to carry out a complete refurbishment. Despite still needing to raise a significant sum, we are confident that we will succeed."

# HOOK AND ODIHAM LIONS CARRY OUT THEIR FIRST PROSTATE CANCER SCREENING

This screening had been in the planning since 2019! The Club intended to carry it out in May 2020 but Covid put a stop to that. However, much of the planning was in place to do it now with the Graham Fulford Charitable Trust taking bookings and provide the phlebotomists, testing the samples, charging just a fee of £20 per test.

Saturday 21 May was the date, Odiham Cottage Hospital the venue and the event took place between 10.00 am and 1.00 pm. The event was advertised on the Club's website, on Facebook and in our main village magazines and on posters also and the Club had "sold out" the 200 available tests three weeks before the event.

No charge was made for this service but donations were received from most of the participants. The Trust's service was excellent and the results were being emailed to participants within 24 hours.

On the day the Club members were joined by Lions from the Loddon Valley, Fleet, Yateley and Farnborough Clubs. Ginny East, the manager of the Odiham Cottage Hospital is thanked for all her help including the refreshments for the helpers. The North Hants Prostate Support Group also gave advice.

In the end 205 men were tested and of these 11 were red and five were amber. Hopefully these men will seek advice and be successfully treated. If so, the main aim will have been achieved. Not a bad result for a Club of 14 members and a great example of Lions "Working together to Serve our Communities".
