# Lions matters of moment



I hope those of you who attended our wonderful convention, got a chance to look at the LCIF stand which had pictures from Turkey. At the start of March, there was a CAIV (Constitutional Area IV of which MD 105 is a part), held at Oakbrook focusing on Turkey. An action committee is now working with Turkish Lions to move things forward. 11 provinces have been affected; the Lions plan to focus on four areas:

- Antakya.
- Kahramanmaras.
- Malatya.
- Adiyaman.

The time has come to focus on rebuilding and the Disaster Relief Committee are discussing several projects with LCIF. After the meeting, a second grant of \$200,000 was approved.

Europe has four of the top donating countries, of those, MD105 is no1 having donated \$107,955. If you or your Club have donated, then

**thank you.** But we must not become complacent, the need to support our charity continues.

On Friday Rolling Fork and other towns and cities in the Mississippi Delta were hit by terrible storms and a Tornado. At least twenty-six people have died in a trail of destruction one hundred miles long and a mile wide. Of the residents of this and other areas affected, 20% live below the poverty line and 21% live in mobile homes. Further storms are forecast. So far a \$10,000 Emergency Recovery Grant (ERG) had been approved and the MD had submitted an application for a Major Catastrophe Grant.

## **CREATIVE THINKING**

Marketers tend to work along well-established lines because they are usually well aware of the Clarence Birdseye syndrome. Some ideas take longer to be accepted than others. Our reality, as Lions, is that we don't really want any of our ideas to take a generation to come to fruition.

This is a major factor with new ideas - they have to be practical and viable (not necessarily the same thing) and they should be able to be brought about NOW.

We have all for some time been fascinated by a meerkat in a waistcoat (now there's an innovation!) trying to sell us insurance. But the meerkat's message is, as he says so himself, 'simples'.

This is perhaps more crudely put as "KISS" - keep it simple, stupid! Ideas to work must start out as simple concepts since the more complicated they are, the longer they may take to become effective.

Let's look at a simple idea. People swimming up and down a pool and being sponsored per lap swum. Despite being surrounded by sea with some of Europe's finest beaches and swimming being a very popular pastime, no-one in my neck if the woods (a daft phrase as we don't actually have any real woods) had thought that a cumulation of breast-strokes and fast crawls could be turned into a fundraiser. The advent of the first public indoor swimming pool, with fresh rather than seawater, sparked the idea. The desire to bring the public into the pool rather than have them just splashing about in the sea, fuelled the idea. A Lion devised how people doing the rather metronomic simple thing of swimming up and down could be turned into a fundraiser. This took place in February 1972 and since then the Jersey Lions Swimarathon has raised more than £3.7 million for good causes.

The Windsor Lions Club is delighted with the response to their offer of a PSA blood test to check for possible signs of prostate problems. The event is being held at Windsor Racecourse on Thursday 20 April between 3.00 pm and 8.00 pm and is aimed at men aged 40 years and over.

Event organiser Lion Diane Purchase declared: "We already have almost 900 bookings with still three weeks to go. If anyone would like to come along, they can book now at

Icw.mypsatests.org.uk/Events. There is no charge but donations are encouraged - either on line or on the day - as the event will cost Windsor Lions in the region of £30,000 to stage. Nevertheless the Club feels that this is a really important part of the work carried out for the community.'

The results are sent out within a week or so to the attendee and take the form of a 'traffic light' system:

GREEN - all clear, AMBER - suggest a retest/follow up and RED - contact your GP straight away.

During the District 105SC 2023 Convention, a brief update was given on childhood cancer.

Research can provide some of the answers and is helping us all to understand:

- Why a child develops cancer;
- Treatments for different types of cancer that are the best for each young patient; and
- Treatments that target the cancer that are less invasive and destructive to healthy cells and organs.


Initial diagnosis, treatment and care may be at a specialist treatment centre, rather than a local hospital. It is not just one person, the patient, with cancer. The lives of family and friends are deeply affected which may last for many months.

Lions Clubs in the Multiple District have pledged to raise funds for research into brain tumours through the partnership with the Brain Tumour Research Charity.

How can we make a difference to childhood cancer patients and perhaps make hospital stays a better experience?

# Jersey Lions 2023 Swimarathon raises £100,000

The 2023 Jersey Lions Swimarathon which took place from Wednesday to Sunday 8 to 12 March has raised almost £100.000.

At the end of the five-day event the 3,500 swimmers had raised around £85,000 and late-coming sponsorships has brought the total almost to £100,000, which does not include the substantial sponsorship of the event by finance house Ravenscroft which covers all the event's running costs. Among the swimmers was Jersey's newly appointed Lt Governor Vice Admiral Jerry Kyd, as well as the Island's Bailiff and members of the government.

The Lions Swimarathon is the Island's biggest fundraiser and has now raised more than £3.7 million since 1972.

From the proceeds the Jersey Lions will be supporting three local foodbanks as the principal beneficiaries as well as many other local good causes plus donations to LCIF,.
